Goal #4: Support the Preservation of Agricultural Lands Kay
Discussion - fall educational series to coordinate with the CPF campaign.
Kay discussed Community Education and Outreach of Agricultural Lands outline.

The plan was approved. The local laws have all been passed!! This part of the work has been completed.

CPP maps. Laura Rose

Laura is working on map updates with ECC and Vassar. They are meeting every few weeks. Completion of this round of updates is targeted for the end of the semester; discussed if Town must approve updates before we add them to the public maps.

Goal #2: Ensure the Town monitors its conservation easements and preserved lands.

Laura Rose

WVLT lawyers, Town lawyers and the Town Supervisor approved the agreement. It was signed in August.

Later in September, WVLT will start monitoring. WVLT will get all monitoring done before December 31, 2022. GOSC can accompany WVLT on site visits. Laura Rose will email the group as scheduling of WVLT becomes available.

Discussed: Is it appropriate for GOSC to stay in the role of supervising the monitoring long term? If not/ to whom do we hand it over and when does this change begin?

Also discussed: Over the long term will GOSC and the CPF committee that decides how to spend the CPF funds, (assuming it's passed,) overlap in their duties?
